What is a Medical Advance Directive?

An advance directive outlines a person's wishes if he or she is incapacitated or unable to express their desire for medical health care and treatment. Every adult has the legal right to consent to or refuse medical treatment and may declare their wishes in writing in the event that they cannot communicate them. This writing is called an Advance Directive. Under federal law, any facility receiving Medicare or Medicaid reimbursements is required to inform patients about these rights. However, you are not required to have an Advance Directive in order to receive care, treatment, or be admitted for care.

What is a Behavioral Health Advance Directive?

Similar to a Medical Advance Directive, a Behavioral Health Advance Directive is a written document where a person declares their wishes regarding behavioral healthcare in the event that they cannot communicate them due to a crisis or other medical condition. In a Behavioral Health Advance Directive, you can express your preferences on where to receive behavioral healthcare and what treatments you are willing to undergo. These wishes may include the use of all, or certain medications, preferred facilities and listings of visitors allowed if you are admitted to facility-based care. Under Colorado law, SummitStone Health Partners must inform you of these rights. However, you are not required to have a Behavioral Health Advance Directive in order to receive care, treatment, or be admitted for care.
